This parish is situated in the north of the barony of Galen. It is bounded on the N. by the County of Sligo; on the N.E. and E. by Kilgarvan ph. And the Co. Sligo; S. by the phs. of Toomore and Killasser; and W. by Ballynahaglish ph. It contains 11,154 acres 1 rood 24 perches, statute measure, including 468a. 1r. 10p. of water.

The living is a vicarage in the Diocese of Killala. Valued in 1834 at £2,215 6s. 11d. In 1833 the Tithes were compounded for £180 7s 6d., being at the rate of 1s. 7.1/2d. Per £. One half of the tithes are payable to the Rev. Joseph Verschoyle, the Vicar, and the other half to Walter James Bourke, lessee of Sir William Palmer, the lay Impropiator. There are large tracts of mountain and bog and several lakes; the remainder of the parish is chiefly under tillage.

It is let to Mr. Franklin, Revenue Officer, who sublets it to 9 occupying tenants at will in divisions, at from £5 to £10 per division. Co. Cess, 3s. 0½d. per acre. Tithe by Composition, £8 6s. 3d., but is withheld by the tenantry. Soil, light clay and moory and rocky (a mountain). Usual crops, oats, potatoes and flax. Bog plenty. Prevailing names, Gallagher and Cawley. Loughdoo is on the boundary between this td. and Kilasser ph. Glendaduff lakes (2) are in this td.; and between this td. and Kilmactigue ph. in Co. ## End of the Parish of Attymass

### Notes

In the north of the parish, on the N.W. margin of Ballymore lake, there stands within a graveyard The ruined church of Kildermot. Its wsestern gable is pulled down to the ground, but its foundation is still traceable. Its side walls are intact, and its eastern gable remains standing. In this gable is a lancet window, widened inside and arched above. It is between 3 and 4ft. high on the outside and 6ft. high on the inside; its outside breadth averages about 6 inches. It commences within 2 or 3ft. of the ground and rises to the height of the side walls; it is fashioned of rudel cut stones. The whole church, on the inside, was only 18ft. by 12ft.

To the west of this church was another building, about 31ft. in length and somewhat wider than Kildermot, as appears by its foundations.
