The 6th edition of 'Parish Renewal' is now available free of charge at the Church & Fr Peyton Centre, with news from around the Cluster.

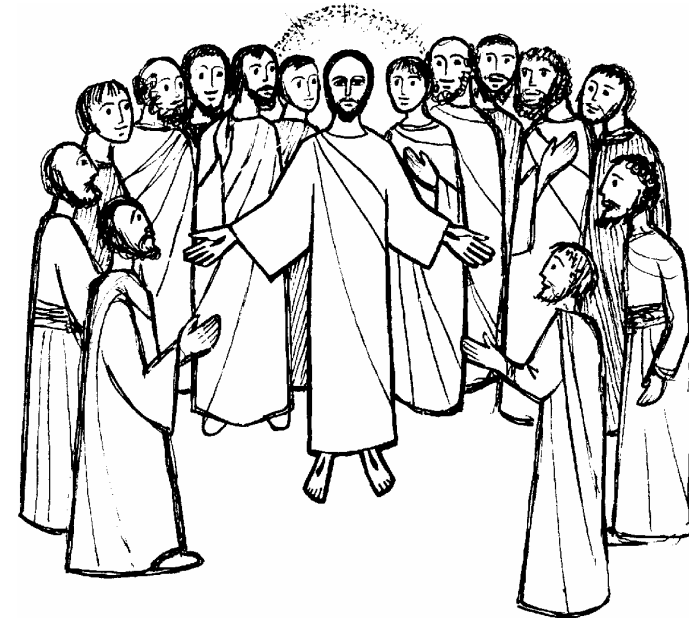
